It was a particularly good night for HCP, which services the Greater Peterborough scheme, as the company was also crowned SPV Management Company of the Year, as well as scooping a Silver in the Culture & Diversity and Environmental, Social and Governance of the Year categories.

Meanwhile, there were wins for Australia's Regional Rail programme (Best Financial Structure and Best Transit categories), Belgrade's energy-from-waste plant (Best Utilities Project), and the UK's Allenby/Connaught army basing scheme (Best Operational Project).

This year's Individual Contribution Award was given to Steve Davies, head of financial innovation at the Welsh Government, for his success in spearheading the delivery of the Mutual Investment Model's first projects.
